## **VIRGINIANS WANT TO KEEP MONUMENTS**

According to a new poll by the L. Douglas Wilder School of Government and Public Affairs at VCU, 49 percent of adult state residents favor leaving Confederate statues in place as they are and 46 percent favor some type of change.

But those supporting changes are far from united with 23 percent of those surveyed favoring moving the statues to museums, 13 percent favor adding context in the current location such as additional signage, and only 10 percent favor removing the statues.

This, according to the Winter 2017-18 Public Policy Poll conducted by the Wilder School's Office of Public Policy Outreach.

For comparison, exit polls conducted by The Washington Post following Virginia's November gubernatorial election that offered only two response options showed 57 percent of Virginians wanting monuments to stay in place and only 39 percent supporting removal.

## **ANOTHER LEFTY CRYBABY**

An Arizona politician says she is undecided if a Confederate Flag display on a colleague's laptop merits a formal complaint under the House's harassment policy.

The Arizona Capitol Times reports State Rep. Geraldine Peten observed the display on a laptop belonging to Rep. Todd Clodfelter as she was seated a row behind him during the House's mandatory sexual harassment training on Tuesday.

The Goodyear Democrat says the display "creates a hostile work environment," and she plans to discuss the matter with the Tucson Republican
